Therefore, Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS) has great pleasure to announce the 2018/2019 Six Continental Essay Competition to all Tanzanian Universities and Colleges students' studying in Tanzania to submit their most inspired essay describing "The Role of Standardization in winning the fight Against Corruption for sustainable Africa's Transformation".

The general objective of the sixth continental essay competitions is to raise awareness on the impact of corruption in the sustainable development of Africa and how the implementation of Standards through effective Quality Infrastructure can be used to create opportunities for the fight against corruption.

Open to: All Universities and Collages' students aged below 35 years

Awards:

At National Level: First: Laptop + 250,000/-
Second: Large Tablet+ 150,000/-
Third: Mini Tablet+100,000/-

Awards:

At continental level: Round trip and accommodation to attend General Assembly for the African Regional Organization for Standardization (ARSO) in Sudan to be honored in 2019; 1st position – (male and female) each USD 1000, 2nd position – USD 800 and 3rd position – USD 500 to be issued by ARSO. If the national finalist will emerge in the top three winners at the regional level.

ENTRY RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

1. Universities and Colleges must be based in Tanzania and recognized by TCU and NACTE respectively for students aged below 35 years.
2. The essay must be original and not previously published.
3. The essay shall be between 1,000 and 1,200 words, formatted in double space, presented in English language, Century gothic font and size 12 preferably in Microsoft office word.
4. Contestants shall be required to provide the following information: full names, name and address of school, mobile phone number, email address on the cover page and Student Identity Card. (N.B: This information shall not be part of the 1,000-1,200 words). Kindly attach a completely filled registration form that can be obtained from www.tbs.go.tz
5. Only one essay shall be submitted by each participant in an electronic format (preferably in Microsoft Word) via email to essay@tbs.go.tz not later than midnight **25th January 2019**.
6. Contestants grant publication rights to organizers and to any of the affiliated organizations if any, as well as the right to release entries to other media.
7. Winners will be selected by a competent, fair and impartial panel of judges put in place by the organizers and decision of the judges shall be final.
8. Graphics within the text are encouraged and can significantly add to the overall content and appeal of a paper. Please visit the organizers website to be acquainted with issues which organizers are looking for.
9. Winners will be contacted and awarded at the Climax Day (date and venue to be communicated).
