NATIONAL FOREWORD

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This standard was adopted by sensory evaluation technical committee, under the supervision of Food and Agriculture Standards Divisional committee (AFDC).

This draft standard describes several types of method for determining the aptitude of assessors and for training assessors to identify and describe odoriferous products.

This draft Tanzania standard is identical to ISO 5496: 2006 – Sensory analysis — Methodology — Initiation and training of assessors in the detection and recognition of odours, which was published by International Organization for Standardization.

TERMINOLOGY AND CONVENTIONS.

This text of International standard, if found suitable, may be approved for publication as Tanzania standard without deviations.

Some terminologies and certain conventions are not identical with those used in Tanzania standards: attention is drawn especially to the following: -

1. The comma has been used as decimal marker for Metric dimensions. In Tanzania standards, it's currently practice to use "full point" on the baseline as decimal marker.
2. Where the words "International standard (s)" appear, referring to this standard they should read "Tanzania Standard(s)".

SCOPE

This International Standard describes several types of method for determining the aptitude of assessors and for training assessors to identify and describe odoriferous products.

The methods described in this International Standard are suitable for use by the agri-foodstuffs industries employing olfactory analysis (e.g. aromatics).

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
