

## **DRAFT TANZANIA STANDARD**

Lighting of work places part 1 - Indoors

## 0. National foreword

The Tanzania Bureau of Standards is the statutory national standards' body for Tanzania, established under the Act. No.3 of 1975, amended by Act. No. 2 of 2009.

This draft Tanzania standard is being prepared by Radiation Technical Committee, under the supervision of the Environmental Management Divisional Standards Committee (EMDC)

This Tanzania Standard is identical to ISO 8995, Lighting of work places part 1 – Indoors published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

## **Terminology and conventions**

Some terminology and certain conventions in the ISO standards are not identical with those used in Tanzania Standards and attention is drawn to the following:

the comma (,) has been used as a decimal marker for metric dimensions. In Tanzania Standards, it is current practice to use a full point (.) on the base line as the decimal marker and

wherever the words "International Standard" appear in this Tanzania Standard, they should be interpreted as "Tanzania Standard".

## 1. Scope

This standard specifies lighting requirements for indoor work places and for people to perform the visual tasks efficiently, in comfort and safety throughout the whole work period.

This standard does not explain how lighting systems or techniques should be designed to optimize solutions for specific work places. These may be found in the relevant CIE guides and reports.
