NATIONAL FOREWORD

This draft Tanzania Standard is the identical adoption of ISO 927:2009) - Spice and Condiments - Determination of Extraneous matter and foreign matter content published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

TERMINOLOGY AND CONVENTIONS

The text of the International standard is hereby being recommended for approval without deviation for publication as draft Tanzania standard.

Some terminology and certain conventions are not identical with those used as Tanzania standards; attention is drawn to the following:

The comma has been used as a decimal marker for metric dimensions. In Tanzania its current practice to use full point on the baseline as the decimal marker.

Whenever the words "International Standard" appear, referring to this standard they should read as "Tanzania Standard(s)".

SCOPE

This Tanzania Standard specifies a general procedure for visual examination, or with magnification not exceeding 10 times, of whole spices for the determination of macro filth. This Standard is applicable to dehydrated herbs and spices.
