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Foreword

Development of the East African Standards has been necessitated by the need for harmonizing requirements governing quality of products and services in the East African Community. It is envisaged that through harmonized standardization, trade barriers that are encountered when goods and services are exchanged within the Community will be removed.

The Community has established an East African Standards Committee (EASC) mandated to develop and issue East African Standards (EAS). The Committee is composed of representatives of the National Standards Bodies in Partner States, together with the representatives from the public and private sector organizations in the community.

Textile garments — Specification — Part 4: Skirts and dresses

1 Scope

This Draft East African Standard specifies requirements, sampling and test methods for skirts and dresses.

This standard does not cover dera dress and school uniforms.

3 Terms and definitions

skirt

garment worn around the waist and extending downwards

3.2

dress

one piece garment that covers the torso and extends down over the thighs or legs

Skirts and dresses shall comply with the colourfastness, restricted chemical substances, pH, fibre composition, packaging and other general requirements specified in DEAS 1141-1.

4.2 Specific requirements

4.2.1 Physical and chemical requirements

Skirts and dresses or the fabric used for the manufacture of dresses and skirts shall comply with the requirements given in Table 1 when tested in accordance with the test methods specified therein.

4.2.2 **Dimensions**

The dimensions of skirts and dresses are as given in Annex A for guidance purposes. Garment measurements may be carried out in accordance with ISO 18890.

Labelling

Skirts and dresses shall comply with the labelling requirements in DEAS 1141-1.

Sampling shall be done in accordance with ISO 2859-1.
