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### **Foreword**

Development of the East African Standards has been necessitated by the need for harmonizing requirements governing quality of products and services in the East African Community. It is envisaged that through harmonized standardization, trade barriers that are encountered when goods and services are exchanged within the Community will be removed.

The Community has established an East African Standards Committee (EASC) mandated to develop and issue East African Standards (EAS). The Committee is composed of representatives of the National Standards Bodies in Partner States, together with the representatives from the public and private sector organizations in the community.

East African Standards are developed through Technical Committees that are representative of key stakeholders including government, academia, consumer groups, private sector and other interested parties. Draft East African Standards are circulated to stakeholders through the National Standards Bodies in the Partner States. The comments received are discussed and incorporated before finalization of standards, in accordance with the Principles and procedures for development of East African Standards.

East African Standards are subject to review, to keep pace with technological advances. Users of the East African Standards are therefore expected to ensure that they always have the latest versions of the standards they are implementing.

## Textile garments — Specification — Part 7: Trousers and shorts

### 1 Scope

This Draft East African Standard specifies requirements, sampling and test methods for trousers and shorts worn by women, men and children.

This standard does not cover school clothing trousers and shorts.

#### 3 Terms and definitions

For the purposes of this document, the terms and definitions given in ISO 8498 and ISO 8499 and the following apply.

#### 3.1

#### trousers

outer garment that covers the lower part of the body consisting of two parts, one for each leg that are joined at the top

#### 3.2

#### shorts

outer garment that covers the lower part of the body consisting of two parts, one for each leg that are joined at the top, but not covering the entire length of the leg

### 4 Requirements

#### 4.1 Additional requirements

Trousers and shorts shall comply with the colourfastness, restricted chemical substances, pH, fibre composition, packaging and other general requirements specified in DEAS 1141-1.

#### 4.2 Physical and chemical requirements

Trousers and shorts, or the fabric used for the manufacture of trousers and shorts shall comply with the requirements given in Table 1 when tested in accordance with the test methods specified therein.

#### 4.3 Dimensions

The dimensions of trousers and shorts are as given in Annex A for guidance purposes. Garment measurements may be carried out in accordance with ISO 18890

#### 4.4 Number of stitches

The stitches in trousers and shorts shall not be less than four per centimetre.

#### 5 Labelling

Trousers and shorts shall comply with the labelling requirements in DEAS 1141-1.

### 6 Sampling

Sampling shall be done in accordance with ISO 2859-1.

### **Dimensions of trousers and shorts**
