## **NATIONAL FOREWORD**

The Tanzania Bureau of Standards is a statutory national standards body for Tanzania established under the Act.No.3 of 1975, amended by Act.No.2 of 2009.

This draft Tanzania Standard is being prepared by the Tobacco and Tobacco products technical committee under supervision of Agriculture and Food Standards Divisional Committee (AFDC)

This draft Tanzania standard specifies methods for the determination of total particulate matter and preparation for the subsequent determination of nicotine-free dry particulate matter present in the smoke from articles made from fine-cut tobacco and expanded tobacco, generated and collected using a routine analytical smoking machine. It also, specifies the method of making of fine-cut tobacco smoking articles using a tube made from a specified wrapper.

This draft Tanzania standard is identical to the ISO 15592-3:2022 Fine-cut tobacco and smoking articles made from it - Methods of sampling, conditioning and analysis - Part 3: Determination of total particulate matter of smoking articles using a routine analytical smoking machine, preparation for the determination of water and nicotine, and calculation of nicotine-free dry particulate matter, published by International Organization for Standardization.

## **TERMINOLOGY AND CONVENTIONS**

This text of the international standards if found suitable, may be approved for application as a Tanzania Standard without deviations.

Some terminology and certain conventions are not identical with those used in Tanzania standards; attention is drawn especially to the following.

- 1) The comma has been used as a decimal marker for metric dimensions. In Tanzania standards, it is current practice to use a full point on the base line as the decimal marker.
- 2) Wherever the words “International Standard” appear, referring to this Standard they should read as “Tanzania Standard”.
