0 NATIONAL FOREWORD

The Tanzania Bureau of Standards is the statutory national standards body for Tanzania, formally established by the Act.No.3 of 1975, which was amended and repealed by Act.No.2 of 2009.

This draft Tanzania Standard is being prepared by the Sensory evaluation Technical Committee, under supervision of Agriculture and Food Standards Divisional Committee (AFDC).

It is identical to **ISO 13302:2003** – Sensory analysis – Methods of assessing modifications to the flavour of foodstuffs due to packaging, published by International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

TERMINOLOGY AND CONVENTIONS

The text of the International standard is hereby being recommended for approval without deviation for publication as Tanzania standard.

Some terminologies and certain conventions are not identical with those used in Tanzania standards; attention is drawn especially to the following: -

- 1) The comma has been used as a decimal marker for metric dimensions. In Tanzania Standards, it is current practice to use “full point” on the baseline as the decimal marker.
- 2) Where the words “International Standard(s)” appear, referring to this standard they should read “Tanzania Standard(s)”.

1 Scope

This International Standard describes methods for assessing the changes caused by packaging to the sensory attributes of foodstuffs or their simulants.

The methodology can be used as initial selection to assess a suitable packaging material or as subsequent acceptability screening of individual batches/production run (see Annex A).
